The iconic RFDS emergency retrieval service operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week and has expanded to provide regular transfers of patients for life-saving medical care, delivering critical support to those who live in rural and remote areas.

A broad range of essential health care services are also delivered by the RFDS to rural and remote communities. This comprehensive health care service includes general practice, Indigenous health, child and family health, social and emotional wellbeing, women's health and health promotion activities.

Today, the RFDS provides the finest care to more than 290,000 Australians each year – that's one person every two minutes.

The Royal Flying Doctor Service is committed to improving access to dental care in regional communities across Queensland.

Since 2013 the Dental Service has been delivering dental care from a purpose-built semi-trailer that visits towns throughout rural and remote Queensland.

The service offers preventive care as well as treatment for a range of oral health conditions at no cost to the patient.

What is the RFDS Dental Service?

The RFDS Dental Service is a mobile dental health service delivered by the Royal Flying Doctor Service (Queensland Section).

The purpose-built semi-trailer, which includes two state-of-the-art dental surgeries, allows the RFDS dental team to provide oral health care to patients living in towns throughout rural and remote Queensland.

There is no out-of-pocket expense to patients using this service.



Who can access the service?

The service is available to everyone and can be accessed by people living or working within and around the communities visited.

If you live in an area that has access to a local private dentist, we encourage you to continue to access that service.



What dental treatments can be provided?

The RFDS Dental Service offers dental care ranging from a simple check and clean through to an extraction.

A team of RFDS Dentists and dental assistants provide care from two purpose-built mobile dental surgeries which include an orthopantomogram, enabling the dentists to take a full x-ray of the teeth and jaw.

Any care the RFDS Dental Service is unable to provide will be referred to an appropriate service provider.



Why is good dental health so important?

Research has shown clear links between oral health and general health.

Gum disease is associated with rheumatoid arthritis, adverse pregnancy outcomes and coronary heart disease. Chronic gum infection can also lead to diabetes complications.

Despite the fact that oral diseases are largely preventable, dental admissions are the highest cause of acute preventable hospital admissions in Australia.

Around 80% of all dental practitioners are located in major cities with less than one per cent working in remote areas.

Research has also shown people living outside capital cities have fewer teeth, more untreated decay, and were less likely to visit a dentist.
